Dear Praying Partner,

As the world continues to experience the economic downturn, religious conflicts and terror threat almost everywhere, injustices, natural disasters of all sort, we are glad that we are alive and have the opportunity to connect once again with you this New Year 2012. Isn't that an indication that the Lord has not finished with us, and still wants us reach and impact many more lives that are yet to meet Christ in and around the world? This is the call that all of us have had from the Lord to reach out to those who could not be just reached without our involvement into their lives.

On our return from the International Conference God had already confirmed to us of His presence in the new wave of ministry initiatives that He was going to work through us. We did not fully understand what it was going to be, until we got back to our ministry field in Liberia when it was made clear to us. Since we got in, we have been engaged in the following ministries:

TREAT FOR CHILDREN

January 16 gave one of the finest weather for the people of Liberia. Coincidentally, it was the very day the new president who happens to be the incumbent, Madam Ellen Johnson Sirleaf to be sworn into office as President for the second term in the Republic of Liberia. The atmosphere was bright and beautiful with air waves full of life, music, news and other national issues. It was a National holiday too, so news vendors sat by their radios to listen to the inaugural program while the children were left, all by themselves to engage on activities of their choice.



Since we knew beforehand what that day would be like, we took advantage of it and had the feeding treat scheduled for that day. Praise the name of the Lord that even though we catered for 300 children, we had about 400 children fed with Jollof rice (special African dish prepared of rice and oil mixed with vegetables, fried fish, sausages and tomato paste), Pop-corn, candies and flavored drinks.



The impact the feeding had on the community was overwhelming. Some people commented that such a thing has "never happened in Robertsport." One parent lamented that politicians have fed people in the past, but "only those within the voting age gap."

The feeding was a big surprise to many. Parents call back to commend us and, to say thanks to us for making their children special and honored. The feeding itself is all about reaching children with the love of Christ through caring and sharing with them of God's blessings thus, we want to thank you all that contributed to making the children very special.

PRISON MINISTRY

As previously planned, the children's treat was to be done in concert with the feeding of prisoners, but during a visit with the prisoners, we noticed that they lacked some basic needs such as tooth brush and paste, bathing and laundering soaps. In response to this need, we bought the listed items and added some biscuits and candies and placed them in little plastic bags and presented to each one in the presence of the officers.



By this little gesture of love extended to the prisoners, we were granted access to meet them in groups of fours to hear their stories and we were able to present the Gospel to them. We want to thank the Lord for successful meetings. Among the 12 inmates

that heard the Gospel, 11 made decision to accept Christ as Savior. Some who can read request that we find them Bibles to read. Please keep them in your prayers, especially those who have given their lives to Christ that they will begin a consistent walk with God.



SOCCER MINISTRY

Since the soccer team was formed and the results have been explosive. Twenty young boys mostly in their youth age have become members. In our last meeting they have consented to our weekly Bible Studies besides the care and sharing and special counseling sessions we shall be having with each of them.



In their commitment to the soccer program, they have identified a parcel of land which they themselves have requested for use for soccer practices should the main field be engaged by the community soccer team. They are now clearing and preparing the parcel of land for their soccer training. Our focus for these young people is that after working with them they will be the catalysts to the future soccer groups that we intend to form.

This first group is the first phase of bringing our vision to life. Please pray that the zeal and momentum this ministry has taken will continue. Also pray for wisdom and patience for us as we invest our time and life in their lives for a positive impact.
