Every day was filled with ministry from neighboring pastors in Fresno, and wonderful blessed reports of the ministries of our own missionaries. Our missionaries are doing a fantastic work in the many places they are working. I was surprised at the reports and so intent and interested hearing of new fields opening up. I enjoyed seeing so many of my old missionary friends. It was wonderful to meet some of our new missionaries, from different countries. I was also interested when Okinawa, Japan, was reported on and the great work they are doing. My thoughts concerning the missionary work - - - things are going great!

I especially enjoyed meeting our missionaries from Liberia. They spoke pretty good English, so I enjoyed visiting with them. She read my book and told me she changed her mind about American missionaries. She is convinced now that we are not spoiled, but are tough enough to take all the hardships. I was also impressed with a Doctor and his wife who have been stationed in Okinawa with the military. His rank is very high in the military but he is becoming a missionary. They will be working in some of the hard countries, like Cambodia.


